

HOVERINGHAM VILLAGE HALL

On the 9th of March 2023 the Village Hall committee met informally to discuss their handover to the Parish council.

As from the 1st April 2023 the Parish Council will be taking over the responsibility and running of the Village Hall.

The retiring committee are very proud to be able to hand over the Village Hall in a very good position both materially and financially. The final funds being handed over are to be ring fenced by the Parish Council for the sole benefit of the Village Hall both now and in the future. The account balance sheet to the 10th March 2023 is shown below.

After the extensive renovations and part re-build of the hall managed by the late Peter Watson and his team with funding from the Lottery, Wren, Trinity College, local businesses and the residents of Hoveringham the new Village Hall management committee was formed.

Throughout, Joyce Allwood has been the mainstay; her role now as it has been for some years is President Emeritus of the Village Hall, our huge thanks to Joyce for her continued support and knowledge.

Further funds have been raised through The Minkley Club which generates a profit of approximately £2000/year, drawn on a monthly basis with prizes of £100, £50 & £25; new members have always been welcomed. The Safari Suppers were very popular and financially beneficial for the Village Hall, but unfortunately since covid have not been organised.

The Village Hall has without doubt become a very popular venue not only for local groups/ activities but also for regular hirers from further afield, many wedding receptions and parties etc.

I offer my sincere thanks to all committee members past and present for their selfless dedication, loyalty, support and hard work through some difficult times resulting in a community facility that we can be very proud of.

About Chapel Field......

The Chapel Field (the play park) used to be the school playground for Hoveringham School. When the school closed in the mid 80s the field was transferred to the Parish Council and is held on trust for the benefit of the village.

Play equipment has been purchased through fundraising efforts and the multi-functional tennis court was also provided thanks to fundraising efforts. The Chapel Field needs to be maintained and renewed and to evolve as a recreational space.

The Parish Council pays for regular quarterly inspections to ensure that the Chapel Field equipment is safe to use and to identify any issues that we need to be aware of. Currently the fencing around the field has been identified as something that will need to be replaced in the near future. Equipment would also benefit from being renewed and added to.

Over the years people in the village, particularly the parents of younger children have got together and raised money to develop and improve the play park and also to help with its maintenance.

So how can you help?

- 1. Consider helping us out with weekly checks of the park. We need help checking over the park. Although we have official quarterly inspections could you help with weekly checks to make sure there is nothing needing urgent repair, to remove litter and to put out the bin for collection?
- 2. Consider becoming part of a group that will take forward the Chapel Field. Maybe you want to fundraise for the maintenance or new equipment, maybe you want to get involved handson with a project for the Chapel Field- e.g. to make it more of a nature friendly space that helps children learn about wildlife?
- **3. Do you have contacts or skills that could help with the Chapel Field?** Maybe you are able to help with a specific thing or have contacts that would help (fencing contractor anyone??)
