

### Parish Council News – Yuletide version! - Dawn Parker

#### So on a festive theme:

**Village Christmas Tree:** we will be putting up the Christmas tree and lights at the crossroads of Gonalston Lane and Main Street – near the bench. As ever we love to see any children's' decorations that will reasonably withstand the weather so feel free to add them!

You've Been Jingled: we will be starting some village fun soon with anonymous gifts around the village- please join in if you can! See details included later in the newsletter.

**Are you alone this Christmas?** There is no need to be on your own at Christmas. There are always volunteers with an extra space at the table or happy to provide a take-out meal if that is easier. Please get in touch with me or any of the Parish Councillors. Equally if perhaps you usually help out a neighbour but won't be home or want us to check (discreetly) if someone would like a Christmas invite, then get in touch.

### Flood Stuff:

A huge thank you to everyone who helped with the flood preparations in October- you were magnificent! A huge thank you too to Creagh Concrete for coming to our aid with free sand! Thankfully the predictions did not come through and the river, in particular, did not behave in the same way as previously which thankfully gave us time for the overflow from the dykes and surface water flooding to subside. We are told by our County Councillor, Roger Jackson, that over 1000 houses were flooded in Notts and over 100 of those were in Lowdham so we have done well. We have however been busy in the background:

We have met with the Environment Agency to report flooding and concerns with flooding down Gonalston Lane (the EA are responsible for the river and for Dover Beck).

We have met with NCC Highways to discuss concerns with highway drains given there are some regular problem areas.

We have passed on our concerns to our District and County Councillor, Roger Jackson and provided written details of issues as well as photos and film of problem areas.

We are also trying to speak to the Internal Drainage Board directly and via Roger to look into some of the delays in the adoption of the flood measures that Tarmac provided, which have yet to be formally adopted by IDB (so as to come under IDB for maintenance) as well as other measures that have been proposed historically to alleviate flood-ing but which have stalled due to the long delays on the terms of Tarmac's exit from Hoveringham.

We have contacted Severn Trent re the flooding from drains and the pumping stations, including asking about the Gonalston Lane pumping station and how often it is pumped out. Unfortunately, this is a big organisation, and the centralised system has yet to yield the name of the relevant local manager we can actually speak to. We have asked for a meeting but other than having a case officer and complaint number assigned, progress has been slow- anyone who has an inside line on the local Severn Trent manager please get in touch!

#### We are working on:

- i. A flood plan with more centralised useful information
- ii. Collating information on the various ditches around the village that are not maintained and may help in dispersing floodwater if they were maintained.
- iii. Buying one or more pumps to have at the village hall (thanks to Roger Jackson who is offering us a contribution via a council grant).
- iv. Brainstorming practical ways we can help to alleviate the risk of flooding.

### FLOOD MEETING:

We are holding a meeting on January 23rd at 6:30pm at the Village Hall. Please come if you want information on flooding and also if you are happy to be or continue to be a flood warden. We will have a draft flood plan for you to look at and we also have various tasks we need help with:

We want to identify flood wardens and a supervisor for each flood zone area who liaises with the flood wardens in their zone to divide up tasks. The flood zones in the village roughly correlate to Gonalston Lane, Main Street and Boat Lane but we need people in some of the outlying areas too.

We are looking at accessing flood warden training and this includes us being able to hold the "Road closed due to Flooding" signage to put up ourselves.

We have been collating information from residents and from previous Parish Councils (thank you Mark Clifford) on how the village has been affected historically and how we can best mitigate flood risks so we understand what has helped historically but also any new risks and what is happening now. We want to carry this on.

We want a simple plan of Hoveringham with the house names on each road (Joyce Allwood did one for Gonalston Lane and we'd like to replicate this for Boat lane and Main Street). This gives us a simple reference point to include in the flood plan- it's not easy to deliver sandbags in the village where almost every house has a name and some are very similar!

Flood database: we want to collate information on people who may need extra help in the event of a flood and people who can offer help or equipment.

We want to reorganise and audit the village hall flood store.

Thursday 21st Dec at 7pm - join us for our magical carol service led by Angela Green. The church will be filled with light and there will be seasonal refreshments following the service.





### You've Been Jingled! A Hoveringham tradition----

This is a little bit of fun to spread some Christmas cheer and you get to ring a door bell and run away!! The idea is to prepare a simple bag with a Christmas gift or gifts and deliver it anonymously to someone in the village with the poem and poster attached and they in turn deliver a gift or two to other people. Anyone can start the ball rolling by leaving an anonymous gift for a neighbour.

### How to Create Your Very First Jingle Gift

Anything can be included as the Jingle gift that's why it is no pressure to prepare one. Once you've decided that you want to jingle other people as well then you can start with your first present-just pick something inexpensive but thoughtful – or even easier put a few Christmas goodies together in a "treat bag".

### What to Do

Deliver your gift anonymously including the poem and the poster- ring the bell and try not to get caught!

### What if I receive an anonymous Jingle gift?

Congratulations you have a secret friend in Hoveringham who prepared this special gift to surprise you! And now you have the opportunity to do the same. But do remember that there's no pressure to do that, especially if you can't get out or you have budget constraints- just enjoy your special present.

If you want to pass this tradition on, then do the same thing for two people in the village. Remember to keep it anonymous and include a copy of the poem and the "We've been jingled" sticker in your gift so that the next person can pass on the tradition- if they would like to or are able. In this way we can spread a little Christmas cheer throughout the village.

Now it's time to stick the "We've been jingled" sticker in a visible spot of your home like the front door or gate. And you're ready (if you'd like to) to think about your jingle gift for someone else!
